

- Reviewed the 2020 audit. The auditors identified no discrepancies
- Met with the TSHA financial advisor and reviewed the investment portfolio. As of September 23, 2022, the portfolio totaled \$1,512,044, which reflected a loss of \$451,898, or 23% of the portfolio, as compared to the S&P 500 with a loss of 23.7%, the Nasdaq with a loss of 31.2%, and the Dow Jones Industrial Average with a loss of 19.78%. As of the end of the year, the portfolio's value was \$1,587,466
- Reviewed the anticipated year-end budget for 2022. At the time of the adoption of the 2022 budget, there was a projected deficit of \$178,383, due primarily to an anticipated continuation of lower membership numbers and lower attendance at the annual Convention as compared to prepandemic numbers. As of September 2022, the anticipated deficit for the end of the year was \$276,709
- Reviewed the proposed budget for 2023. The FAC and the

Executive Board, with the assistance of the Executive Director, worked diligently on the budget originally proposed with a deficit of \$342,351, which includes a necessary upgrade to the website in the approximate amount of \$55,000. The deficit budget was reduced to \$278,449. The website expenses have been anticipated for the past two years. The remainder of the deficit in the amount of \$223,449 is related to an increase in operations due to inflation and a conservative estimate for membership and Convention attendance

The Texas Speech-Language-Hearing Foundation (TSHF), a 501(c)(3) charitable foundation, supports student scholarships, clinical research, and exceptional programs for the benefit of audiologists and speech-language pathologists who serve individuals with communication disorders.

On behalf of the TSHF, we are proud to share the following 2022 highlights:

- The Foundation proudly awarded \$48,800 in scholarship, research grants, educational awards, and service awards at the TSHA 2022 Convention in Fort Worth
- The Foundation is preparing to give scholarships, grants, and awards to deserving recipients in 2023
- The breakfast awards event at the TSHA 2022 Convention was a great success in spite of the icy and snowy weather. Twelve Texas universities showed support by purchasing tables as well as the Association, Fort Worth ISD, and a table in memory of Dr. Lear Ashmore
- The online auction and Kendra Scott pop-up were exciting and successful
- Article contributions were submitted to every *Communicologist* for publication
- The Thelma Zirkelbach Pediatric Scholarship Fund was created and fully endowed
- The Frank Brister Doctorate of Audiology Endowment Fund was fully funded
- The Judson Erik Mount Memorial Fund was created and executed for future funding
- The first graduate student member of the Foundation completed a two-year term in December
- The Foundation increased social media notifications through the website, an annual newsletter, Facebook, and Instagram
