TSHA Accessibility Guidelines: PowerPoint Presentations Checklist

Font and Text

- □ Heading/title fonts should be 44 points or greater.
- □ Text fonts should be 36 points or greater.
- □ Avoid using text shadow or glow effects for any text.
- □ Using italics or uppercase letters for emphasis is not recommended.

Color

- □ Use appropriate color contrast (e.g., black and white).
- Make sure that all information conveyed with color is also conveyed in black and white.

Layout

□ Minimize the number of lines on each slide. Place no more than six lines of text on a slide (excluding columns).

Audio

Provide a script of your comments to the State Office before recording. Your presentation will include captioning on each slide.

Images

- □ Replace graphics with text whenever possible.
- Include a text slide after each picture/graph slide that describes what is seen in the picture/graph. Note that the meaning of the graphic is needed, not a description.
 - Example:
 - Incorrect: "Chart with blue and red bars."
 - Correct: "Data from this chart illustrates that people with disabilities report spending more time in the emergency room than people without disabilities."

Slide Animations and Transitions

- □ Avoid automatic slide transitions.
- □ If your slides contain animations, ensure they are brief and do not distract from the most important content on the slide.

Hyperlinks



- □ Any hyperlink should have context and a description of where it leads.
- □ Avoid using "Click here" or "More info" as a link title.
- □ Show full URLs (e.g., http://www.google.com).

Embedded Audio or Video

□ If your presentation has embedded audio or video, you should include text transcripts and/or captions.
