Audiology & Speech – Language Pathology Interstate Compact

- The Interstate Compact facilitates the practice of speech-language pathology (SLP) and audiology in member states. (Currently 23)
- 23,500 licensed Speech-Language Pathology and Audiology professionals practice in Texas.
- 17,300 practitioners practice within 100 miles of one of our borders.
- There is a severe shortage of speech-language pathologists in Texas, particularly in rural areas. A 2022 TSHA survey indicated 89% of school districts reported a shortage of SLPs.
- The Compact would facilitate the use of Telepractice to provide services to areas of need, in schools, hospitals and clinics.
- The Compact preserves the regulatory authority of states (Texas) to protect the public through state licensure. Anyone practicing in Texas must adhere to Texas licensure laws.
- Enhance the exchange of licensure, investigative and disciplinary information among member states.
- Saves our licensees who want to practice in another "compact" state from buying their license.
- Joining the Interstate Compact and paying fees would be completely optional for Texas licensees.
- The Interstate Compact would not be a burden to TDLR nor add cost to the State of Texas. All costs would be incurred by those professionals who choose to participate in the Interstate Compact.
