of the many committees and task forces of this Association.

HONORS AND AWARDS COMMITTEE

Chaired by Martha Wristen

This Committee reviewed applications for the Awards of the Association, the Jack L. Bangs and the Rolland J. Van Hattum. The Award of Honors, which is presented to speechlanguage pathologists and audiologists who have contributed significantly to TSHA and demonstrated outstanding leadership in the profession, was presented to Melissa Sweeney, Denise Barringer and Lynda Barbee. Julie Noel was presented with the Jack L. Bangs Award for her contributions to both TSHA and ASHA. Cherry Wright was selected as the Texas nominee for the Rolland J. Van Hattum award, which is presented by the American Speech-Language-Hearing Foundation. Cherry's nomination for this award was made because of her work on the shortages of speech-language pathologists in the state of Texas. All of these recipients received their awards at the TSHFoundation Luncheon on Friday, February 22, 2008, during the Convention in San Antonio.

ETHICAL PRACTICES

Chaired by **Benna Askew**

No reports of ethical misconduct for the year were made. Benna and her committee examined a procedural issue which may be considered as policy for this committee.

NOMINATIONS COMMITTEE

Chaired by Carolyn Perry

Carolyn and her committee submitted a full slate of candidates for the 2008 elections. Candidates for Vice President for Educational and Scientific Affairs were **Lauren Mathews** (elected) and **Kelly Lauck**; candidates for Vice President for Social and Governmental Policy were **Bess Fjordbak** (elected) and **Bobbie Kay Turkett**; candidates for Vice President for Research and Development were **Jan Lougeay** (elected) and **Angela Standridge.**

This was the first year members had the option to vote online or by paper ballot. The online voting was provided by Election Services Corporation, the same group who manages the ASHA online voting. The Committee is considering ways to increase participation in the election process and ways to better market the candidates to the membership. They are already looking ahead to the next election cycle, which will include President-Elect, Vice President for Public Information and Marketing, and Vice President for Professional Services.

GRADUATE STUDENT REPRESENTATIVES

Erin Ludeke (Texas Christian University) and **Liz Mathukutty** (Stephen F. Austin State University)

Erin and Liz attended all Executive Board meetings this past year and provided valuable input from a student's perspective. They coordinated the student volunteer efforts for Convention and wrote articles for the *Communicologist*. Erin rotated off the board at the end of June, and the new student who will join the board is **Samantha Bisch** from Texas A&M University-Kingsville. She will attend her first Executive Board meeting in September.

PUBLIC SCHOOL SLP VACANCY COMMITTEE

Chaired by Cherry Wright

Members of the Public School Speech-Language Pathology (SLP) Vacancy Committee served as representatives to the Joint Committee of the Texas Speech-Language-Hearing Association (TSHA) and the Texas Council of Administrators of Special Education (TCASE). The Joint Committee held three meetings and continued to address their action plans. Cherry Wright participated in the TSHA Executive Board strategic planning session in order to provide input regarding the action plans and activities of the Joint Committee. The Joint Committee continued to research models of service delivery. Diana Christiana of the TSHA Telepractice Task Force shared information with the Joint Committee during the Annual Convention in San Antonio. Presentations were made at the TSHA Convention and TCASE Conferences and the Committee provided input to the Vice President for Educational and Scientific Affairs in reference to collection of Eligibility Template implementation information. An email contact list was established including Regional Education Service Center (ESC), SLP representatives, and District Lead SLPs to enhance input related to personnel shortages and communication of activities of the Joint Committee. A survey was developed and distributed to Directors of Special Education to gather information regarding current shortages of SLPs in the state and implementation of strategies to address the shortage. The Committee continued to dialogue with the TSHA University Task Force. A meeting was held with representatives of the 17 universities to explore the Ohio Master's Network Initiatives in Education (OMNIE) project. Representatives of five universities expressed an interest in researching the possibility of a collaborative project. Two meetings were held with the five representatives. As a result, two universities have increased enrollment and are implementing pilot projects to provide non-traditional opportunities for students to complete leveling coursework. Dialogue with the universities will continue to explore different venues for addressing the issue of shortages in the public schools. Additional information was collected and posted on the TSHA website. The Committee met with the Coalition of Related Professional Associations to share information regarding personnel shortages and strategies to address the resulting issues. The Texas Physical Therapy Association and the Texas Occupational Therapy Association expressed interest

in working with TSHA and TCASE regarding legislation for loan repayment. Other points of discussion included the need for practicum experiences in the public schools and innovative models of service delivery. The Committee continues to seek "Best Practices" in the public schools and to publish information in the *Communicologist* and on the TSHA website.

PUBLICATIONS BOARD

Chaired by Melinda Corwin

Dee Kirby and Lynly Stephen continue to serve as alternating editors of the Communicologist, which was published on time every other month this year. Lisanne Taylor developed an article tracking guide for the Communicologist to better document the type and volume of information that TSHA is providing to its members. Kathy Clapsaddle devised a system for monitoring the TSHA website and all of its postings and links. This project will be implemented, evaluated, and modified as needed during the 2008-2009 year. The 2007 issue of the TEJAS was published and mailed to members. Tim Meline served as editor. Full issues of the 2006 and 2007 issues of TEJAS are available on the TSHA website (by entire issue and by individual article), and the State Office is currently working on archiving all previous TEJAS issues on the site. Melinda Corwin, Dee Kirby, and Ellen Bennett Lanouette submitted photos depicting the professions of speech-language pathology and audiology for the home page of the TSHA website. Other TSHA members sent photos as well. Go to www.txsha.org and continue to click Refresh to see all of the photos currently in the photo bank. Lisanne Taylor developed a working draft of writing style guidelines, which will hopefully be added to the Policies and Procedures manual for 2008-2009. The Publications Board reviewed, edited, and approved over 50 items for TSHA in the following forms: journal, children's book, newsletters, brochures, booklets, letters, posters, email blasts, flyers, billboards, and website postings. The Pub Board would like to thank Traci Miller from the State Office for her strong work ethic and efficient style. She makes our job much easier!

BYLAWS

Two bylaws proposals were submitted to the membership at the 2008 Annual Business Meeting in San Antonio. Both proposals were unanimously approved. The TSHA Executive Board will now include a Vice President for Research and Development. This vice president will be responsible for the development of new topics of interest and ideas leading to the advancement of our professions, and for the promotion of selected areas of interest, which may include technology, administration, clinical technique, research, and education. The membership also approved the removal of our Mission Statement from the Bylaws, to be included with the current Vision Statement in a Preamble to the Bylaws.

FINANCIAL ADVISORY COMMITTEE

The Financial Advisory Committee (FAC) held one meeting via conference call last summer to review the proposed TSHA 2007-2008 budget. The FAC submitted questions and comments to the Executive Board. In December, the FAC met in Austin to perform our first internal audit. It was a successful learning experience for all. Based on findings, the FAC submitted suggestions to the Executive Board.

STRATEGIC PLANNING

TSHA worked diligently this year to provide continuing education (CE) activities to our members. One activity was the 52nd Annual Convention: Building Bridges through Communication in San Antonio, Texas which hosted

4,153 attendees. Through the dedication of volunteers and our State Office, this Convention was the largest to date.

COUNCILOR FOR PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT

Chaired by Karen King

Karen King oversaw the tasks of the Continuing Education (CE) Processor, Independent Study, Speech CE, and Audiology CE Approval Chairs. She developed the continuing education codes that were listed in the onsite program book. Karen organized volunteers to review and input Convention continuing education hours and is the contact for any questions pertaining to Convention CE hours. She is currently collaborating with her Committee on a new process for inputting Convention hours for the 2009 Convention.

CONTINUING EDUCATION (CE) PROCESSOR

Chaired by Leon Barbee

Leon Barbee continues to spearhead moving the TSHA CE application process to be efficient and accessible for the members. Anyone interested in hosting a TSHA CE sponsored event can easily apply for TSHA CE hours online at www.txsha.org. Leon processed 665 continuing education activities. He continues to make sure all continuing education hours are transferred to the TSHA CE registry, which is free to all TSHA members. Leon is working on a system to implement for the 2009 Convention to help upload and confirm attendees' hours efficiently.

ASHA CONTINUING EDUCATION (CE) PROCESSOR

Chaired by Loretta Lee

Loretta Lee processed ASHA CE applications as well as all the TSHA Annual Convention ASHA hours. She also helped to ensure that all CE processes were in compliance with ASHA standards.

INDEPENDENT STUDY

Chaired by Janice E. Stroud

Janice Stroud met the needs and interests of many TSHA members by providing CE opportunities that were individualized. She processed the TSHA/ASHA independent study applications, supplied necessary information about the study, and approved, monitored, and processed independent study projects. The application has moved online and is user-friendly for members.

SPEECH CE APPROVAL

Roya Daryapayma received and approved the speech CE applications. After reviewing the information, she determined if the programs met the criteria for TSHA CE hours and then submitted the approval to Leon Barbee, who completed the process.

AUDIOLOGY CE APPROVAL

Pam Bender received and approved the audiology CE approval applications. After reviewing the information, she determined if the programs met the criteria for TSHA CE hours and then submitted the approval to Leon Barbee, who completed the process.

REGIONAL SEMINAR FUNDING GRANTS

Chaired by Renee Bogschutz

Renee Bogschutz received and processed applications with her committee for the TSHA Seminar Grants. The purpose of the

grants is to allow local associations, National Student Speech-Language-Hearing Association (NSSLHA) chapters, or other groups to defray costs incurred in providing regionally advertised seminars or workshops for speech-language pathologists and/ or audiologists. Renee worked with the State Office to place the regional seminar grant applications online to make the procedure easier for applicants. She developed a criteria rating form for the committee to use to rate each individual program. Four grants were awarded this year and were announced in the *Communicologist* and at the TSHA Annual Business Meeting held during the Annual Convention in San Antonio.

COUNCILOR FOR ANNUAL TSHA CONVENTION Chaired by **Melanie McDonald**

Melanie provided a great deal of support this year by sharing her expertise and taking initiatives to help bring the 2008 Convention to a huge level of success. She participated in the program planning for both the Convention and summer symposium. She was an integral part in arranging transportation, providing hospitality, and communicating with major speakers. Melanie helped transport and was the TSHA contact for our keynote speaker, Dr. Temple Grandin. She helped monitor programming at the 2008 Convention. She recently participated in the post-Convention/pre-Convention meeting and is in the process of contacting major speakers for the 2009 Convention.

CONVENTION PROGRAMMING COMMITTEE

Co-Chaired by Lauren Mathews and Tori Gustafson

Lauren Mathews was in charge of the Program Committee's review of each *Call for Papers* submission and approval of all Convention sessions. It was her task to schedule each session and collaborate with the State Office to produce handouts and meet audio-visual needs. Tori Gustafson helped edit the pre-Convention brochure and onsite program. Both Lauren and Tori coordinated the many details involved with short courses and advanced speakers. TSHA offered 118 traditional presentations, 4 major speakers, 4 advanced courses, 6 short courses, and 21 poster sessions. There were 6 cancellations and 4 closed sessions (3 were in the medical speech pathology strand in 45-person capacity rooms). The Program Chairs met in May for post-Convention/pre-Convention meeting and started the planning for major, advanced, and short course speakers for the 2009 Convention in Austin, Texas.

LOCAL ARRANGEMENTS COMMITTEE

Co-Chaired by Bobbie Kay Turkett and Michelle Mendietta

The Local Arrangements Committee helped everyone feel welcome in San Antonio for the 2008 Convention. They were responsible for the various Convention subcommittees to ensure quality and efficiency during Convention such as registration, hospitality, volunteers, signs, transportation, photography, and social. After Convention they compiled reports from all subcommittees with suggestions for the following year. Bobbie Kay created a timeline to facilitate local arrangements for the 2009 Convention in Austin. She participated in the post-Convention/ pre-Convention meeting in Austin. Bobbie Kay and Michelle have agreed to remain as Local Arrangements co-Chairs for the 2009 Convention.

EXHIBITS COMMITTEE

Co-Chaired by Kathy Barker and Rebecca Linke

Kathy and Rebecca did an excellent job organizing exhibitors at the 2008 Convention. They were responsible for dealing with exhibitors and their needs throughout Convention. They worked to provide over 188 exhibitors for TSHA members this year. Other Exhibit Hall activities included Cyber Café, beverage breaks for members, exhibit drawings, and door prizes. After Convention they compiled feedback forms from exhibitors and reported the information during the post-Convention/pre-Convention meeting in Austin.

JOB PLACEMENT COMMITTEE

Job placement was a big success at the 2008 Convention. Raedeen was responsible for helping design the new job placement set up, gaining volunteers to work shifts, and setting up the dry erase board schedule grid. Many members mentioned how great the set up was this year. Sixty-nine companies and 122 applicants participated in the job placement process. Raedeen submitted a post-Convention report with the new procedures outlined and suggestions for next year. She participated in the post-Convention/ pre-Convention meeting in Austin.

SUMMER SYMPOSIUM COMMITTEE

The Committee met and planned speakers and events for the special 10 continuing education hours summer symposium held in Breckenridge, Colorado, in July of 2008. They approved the brochure and worked on the best way to market the unique continuing education opportunity during the past year. The Committee promoted the summer symposium at the TSHA 2008 Convention. They developed and sent a form to all summer symposium attendees about how to submit a case study to be reviewed at the symposium. They also developed the scavenger hunt for the evening special event.

COUNCILORS FOR PROFESSIONAL SERVICES

These wonderful ladies kept this vice presidency organized and task oriented by communicating with their selected Task Force Chairs to ensure that the support and information needed was available to them. All reports and financial forms were reviewed prior to submission.

PUBLIC SCHOOL ADVISORY COMMITTEE

Chaired by JoAnn Wiechmann

The Public School Advisory Committee (PSAC) researched issues of concern to speech-language pathologists (SLP) working in the public schools. These issues were highlighted at the Public School Forum held at the Convention and included information on Response to Intervention (RtI) shared by JoAnn Wiechmann, an update on eligibility templates shared by **Debra Bankston**, and ASHA initiatives shared by State Education Advocacy Leaders (SEAL) Representative **Becky Gonzalez** and State Advisory Representative **Judy Rudebusch**. A number of issues including SLP shortages, bilingual speech services, service delivery models, TEA advocacy, and dysphagia in the schools were identified, and action plans were developed for the coming year.

TRAINING OF TRAINERS COMMITTEE

Chaired by Debra Bankston

This was another eventful year for this Committee. Some activities included updating sessions for the trainers in each of the five eligibility templates which was conducted at Convention. For the first time, one of the templates, articulation, was offered for training to the general membership by Lynda Barbee, Sue Johnsen, and Cindy Gill, and training of trainers for the cultural and linguistic diversity (CLD) companion to the Articulation Eligibility Template was conducted by Lynette Austin, Gina Glover, Becky Gonzalez, and Roxanna Ruiz-Felter at Convention as well. Ideas for a Summer Institute for template trainings and more template trainings at the next Convention were discussed. Allan Bird was selected to serve in the capacity of collecting data on the eligibility templates. An email list was created to include the names of lead speech-language pathologists serving the public schools throughout the state. A survey regarding the use of the eligibility templates was developed and distributed to the lead SLPs statewide. Allan continues to monitor the template trainings and update the schedule for trainings on the website. The names of trainers are posted on the TSHA website.

ASSISTIVE TECHNOLOGY TASK FORCE

Co-Chaired by Angela Standridge and Sheryl Haeusler

This group was instrumental in locating a major speaker for Convention. They also contributed several presentations at Convention and submitted an article to the *Communicologist*. A draft document on the role of speech-language pathologists/ audiologists in assistive technology (AT), basics of AT assessment/ report writing, AT intervention strategies, and resources for more AT training was developed. Work will continue over the summer in hopes of completing this document by September. Assistive Technology Task Force members have stayed in touch via the AT email list.

CULTURAL & LINGUISTIC DIVERSITY (CLD) ISSUES TASK FORCE Co-Chaired by Lynette Austin and Gina Glover

The CLD Issues Task Force has continued to develop articles for the *Communicologist* (CLD Corner) and the TSHA website. The Diversity link on the website was re-organized and updated with a user-friendly design format. Students from 15 universities participated at the CLD student event held at Convention, which included two book scholarships and a round table discussion on evidence-based practice in serving CLD populations.

CLD COMPANION TO THE ARTICULATION TEMPLATE

Co-Chaired by Becky Gonzalez and Roxanna Ruiz-Felter

The CLD Companion to Articulation Eligibility Template was completed this year and submitted to the Executive Board for approval. Speech-language pathologists were selected as trainers of this template, and training was conducted at Convention over 2 days. A list of trainers is posted on the TSHA website.

EVIDENCE-BASED PRACTICE TASK FORCE

Chaired by Jenny Katz

This Task Force was created this year. Members were recruited and goals identified. In addition, an article for the *Communicologist* was developed and submitted for publication.

MEDICAL ISSUES TASK FORCE

Chaired by Marte Hersey

The Medical Issues Task Force established a pool of competencies and completed the minimum guidelines for competencies with modified barium swallow studies, fiberoptic endoscopic evaluation of swallowing, tracheostomy evaluations with speaking valves, and videostroboscopy evaluations. The competencies have been placed on the TSHA website under the Practice Guidelines link. The Medical Issues email list has provided a means of staying in touch with members in the medical field.

PRIVATE PRACTICE ISSUES TASK FORCE

Chaired by Barbara Samfield

The Private Practice Issues Task Force continues to work tirelessly on issues for the TSHA membership. Three surveys were developed and distributed via email, provider network directories were updated, and Business Institute presentations at Convention were planned and implemented. The Task Force held a networking dinner at Convention. This group has also addressed provider and consumer issues related to insurance billing, developed email list discussions, and submitted articles to the *Communicologist*.

TELEPRACTICE TASK FORCE

Chaired by Diana Christiana

A roundtable discussion was held at Convention. The Telepractice State of Affairs PowerPoint presentation was posted on the TSHA website, and Diana Christiana spoke at the TSHA/Texas Council of Administrators of Special Education (TCASE) Joint Committee meeting about the ways that telepractice is being used in the public schools. She also attended the American Telemedicine Association Conference, where the Medicare Telehealth Improvement Act was discussed. This act would include coverage for occupational therapy, physical therapy, speech therapy, and audiology. If passed, this act will expand telepractice outside of schools and into the medical realm (Telerehab). Janet Brown, Director of Health Care Services for ASHA, was invited to present on telepractice and current trends at the 2009 TSHA Convention. Diana met with Janice Brannon, Director of State Special Initiatives, Government Relations and Public Policy for ASHA. They discussed the need for a committee or a group of representatives from across the country to work together on state licensure provisions and issues in telepractice.

UNIVERSITY BASED TASK FORCE

Co-Chaired by Ann Hillis and Jan Lougeay

This year the University Based Task Force completed and distributed a PowerPoint presentation on clinical supervision. To date it has been used by four universities for workshops, and three additional universities report that it will be used this summer in either workshops or as independent study materials for supervisors.



VICE PRESIDENT FOR PUBLIC INFORMATION AND MARKETING DONISE PEARSON

Public Information and Marketing had a whirlwind year! A TSHA bylaws change in 2006 required the TSHA Executive Board to appoint a Vice President to fill a one-year term in this office. So began the challenge to set up external short-term and long-range plans to advertise our professions; educate legislators;

market to physicians, school administrators, and insurance medical directors; and inform the general public about who we are and what we do. Internal marketing needs were also addressed in order to recruit new members and retain current members.

UNIVERSITY VISITS

This year the current Executive Board members and elect-officers were busy visiting 17 Texas university programs in speechlanguage pathology and audiology. Excellent presentations to recruit student members and provide valuable information were provided under the guidance of Melissa Whitaker, University Visits Task Force Chair. TSHA was also contacted by Texas A&M International University in Laredo with the news that they recently began an undergraduate program in communication sciences and disorders. Now there will be 18 universities to visit next year!

Co-Chairs Lora Carlini and Paige Preston provided fabulous student initiatives. We can proudly boast that 735 students registered for Convention. Once again students topped our priority list, and the Student Interests Task Force outdid themselves with unbelievable student activities.

TSHA members may request 25 free copies to provide to a preschool class, doctor's office, Head Start Center, library, church, or any other preschool entity. Requests for over 25 copies must be approved by the Vice President for Public Information and Marketing. Jessica Rowe, Public Information Distribution Committee Chair, spear-headed this unique initiative and worked to effectively disseminate this public information.

MAY IS BETTER HEARING AND SPEECH MONTH

May is Better Hearing and Speech Month (MBHSM) Task Force Chair Katie Stoneman completed double duty this year by also chairing the Work Arena Public Relations Task Force. MEMBERSHIP COMMITTEE

CAREER AWARENESS

The packets provided a beautiful new brochure that lists the 17 accredited universities in Texas with speech-language pathology and/or audiology programs. It tells

GRASSROOTS DEVELOPMENT TASK FORCE

Through the work of this Task Force, members of TSHA were provided with various opportunities to become legislatively active this past year. Task Force Co-Chairs did a fantastic job working behind the scene to prepare for and help organize the VoterVoice campaign at the TSHA Convention. Excitedly, more than 350 TSHA members registered on VoterVoice and over 700 emails were sent to legislators. This Task Force was also extremely helpful in organizing TSHA's first District Legislative Day. Over 70 strategic legislators were identified by Larry Higdon, TSHA's Director of Legislation, and Mark Hanna, TSHA's Lobbyist and Legal Counsel, as those who should be contacted. These individuals received a gift from TSHA during May is Better Hearing and Speech Month. TSHA members from all over the state visited legislators in their home district offices during the May District

Legislation Day. TSHA members in Austin, El Paso, Dallas, Plano, Grand Prairie, Houston, San Antonio, and Lubbock reported that they called on legislators. Speech-language pathologists and audiologist from private practices, school districts, in-patient hospitals, and universities took time from their schedules to build relationships with state policy makers.

This Task Force has collected testimonies from consumers and their families to create a booklet titled "Texans Talk." This will be available to TSHA members to give to their legislators at the next "TSHA Takes A Stand" legislative event at the Capitol during TSHA's 2009 Annual Convention. The books will also be available at the TSHA State Office for future advocacy initiatives.
